

MASS/DRESS UP DAY DRESS

Chaminade reserves the right to require special “dress up” for certain special events such as Masses, assemblies, etc. The dress code for these events is outline below and is announced well in advance to the student body. With modesty as the guiding value, students are required to be in this dress code on these days.

Ladies:

Dressy pant outfits, knee length dresses or skirts with a blouse may be worn. Dress shoes must be worn. Outfits may be of any color or pattern of colors. The following are not appropriate:

Backless/halter top apparel	skin-tight apparel
Bare midriff blouses	spaghetti strap tops
Mini-skirts	tank top dress/blouses
Off-the-shoulder tops	T-shirt tops
See-through blouses/skirts	capris/shorts

Gentlemen:

A dress shirt and conventional/bow tie must be worn. A sports jacket or blazer is optional but preferred. Dress slacks and dress shoes and socks must be worn. Clothing may be of any color or pattern of colors. The following are not appropriate: string ties, tennis/athletic shoes, or shorts.

Students/Parents are encouraged to call the Deans’ Office about any questionable clothing prior to the event. The Deans are the final arbiter in all dress code matters. Students who violate the special dress code will receive a Saturday detention.

SPIRIT AND SENIOR DRESS

On Spirit Days students may wear blue jeans (without holes, frayed edges, or patches) with their Spirit T-shirt. Students who are in jeans with no Spirit T-shirt will receive a Saturday detention. Students may wear their regular uniform on these days.

Seniors may wear their senior clothing with blue jeans (without holes, frayed edges, or patches) on Fridays. Seniors who are in jeans without their senior dress will receive a Saturday detention.

Consequences for Dress Code Violations:

Students who are out of dress code and are unable to correct their dress may be sent home and/or not be able to attend classes until their dress is corrected. The disciplinary consequence for students out of dress code for the first time in a semester is an after school detention, if the violation is rectified. The Dean of Students may assign a Saturday detention if the infraction is not rectified, but the student can attend classes. The second, and any subsequent dress code violation during the semesters, may receive a Saturday detention.
